UCW supplies the coffee, tea, drink crystals, creamers, sugar & sweetener for all Trinity functions.



Trans Day of Remembrance Vigil Held at Knox United Church

Club Q shooting an ugly reminder of hatred and transphobia

A group of around 40 people, including members of the LGBTQ2S+ community and their allies, met at Knox United Church, Brandon, on November 19 to remember victims of transphobia violence. But they had no way of knowing that at the very moment of their vigil a gunman entered the Q Club in Colorado Springs killing five and injuring 19 people – because of who they were.

The victims, including members of the LGBTQ community and allies, were:

- Raymond Green Vance (he/him), 22
- Kelly Loving (she/her), 40
- Daniel Aston (he/him), 28
- Derrick Rump (he/him)
- Ashley Paugh (she/her), 35



Knox United Church, Brandon

The Transgender Day of Remembrance, observed every year on Nov. 20, is an international day of mourning and memorial for transgender people who were killed in the past year. At the service in Brandon, the names of 390 people killed during the past year were read out loud, followed by the lighting of candles in their honour. (This is the number officially recorded, but the true number is likely much higher).

Although the keynote speaker at the Knox remembrance event, <u>Leila Praznik</u>, focused on "the joyful experiences that have come as part of me discovering my true gender", they cautioned that at the same time there

must be recognition of how bigotry can prevent transgender, non-binary, and gender-diverse people from living joyfully. Praznik said her hope is others will be able to share in the happiness she has found by embracing her authentic gender. Those experiences can serve to fight transphobia, she said.



"That's the idea we should strive for, to not have to do this service, to not have these several dozens, perhaps even hundreds of names that we have to read out every year because of transphobic violence." Regrettably, the Colorado Springs shooting is a graphic reminder that we have not reached this ideal and that there is much work left to be done to make our world a safe place for everyone. Let us all do our part to make it so.



How do you help someone who's lost their Christmas spirit? Nurse them back to elf.




Trinity's Senior Sunday School pose in front of the tree with cards for gifts for the Christmas Hampers.





Another very generous financial gift has come to Trinity from Central United funds. ...
