

Wrong Turn Bust

The Mounties say an American man entered the wrong GPS coordinates and accidentally ended up in Canada—which probably wouldn't have been a major issue if his car hadn't been full of cannabis and cash. In a press release, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police said the driver took a wrong turn last month and ended up in the border lineup at the Rainbow Bridge crossing in Niagara Falls. "As the driver had no passport, he was referred for a secondary examination," the RCMP said. Officials found around 400 pounds of cannabis in the vehicle, along with more than \$602,000 in American dollars. The RCMP said the cannabis and currency was separated into boxes and vacuum-packed bundles. They described the find as "highly suspicious evidence." The driver, 60-yearold California resident Andrew Lee Toppenberg, faces multiple charges including importing cannabis and possession of proceeds of property over \$5,000 according to reports. He was remanded into custody pending a bail hearing.




