

How to keep all the cookies to yourself:



10 Bible Passages that Teach a Christian Perspective on Homosexuality

The long history between the church and LGBTQ people is one fraught with tension, pain, and, sometimes, violence. Most of the Christian debate about human sexuality has centered on interpretation and emphasis of a few Bible passages, sometimes referred to as "clobber verses".

But there are other Scriptures that can guide faithful Christians who seek a godly understanding of sexual and gender identity. The following verses emphasize the value of love over the law, and the special affirmation of those who have been historically rejected as unclean or unholy.



1) Genesis 1:26: "Let us create humankind in our image."

God makes clear that, out of all of creation, human beings are created in God's image. Someone may look — or love — differently than you do, but simply by being human, reflect the image of God.

2) Acts 10:15: "What God has made clean; you must not call profane."

When Peter protests a command by God to eat food that is deemed "unclean" by Jewish law, God reminds him that God's declaration of what is clean is above, and may even contradict, any command of the law. This reminds us that God's wishes for us are not

defined by our own rules or boundaries or understandings of scriptures.

3) Acts 8:26-40: "What is to prevent me from being baptized?"

Although eunuchs were ostracized because of their failure to adhere to sexual norms and barred from inclusion in God's community, this eunuch seeks to follow the path of Christ. His question "What is to prevent me from being baptized?" underscores that his sexual status is not a barrier to inclusion in the eyes of God.

4) Isaiah 56:3-5: "For thus says the Lord: To the eunuchs who keep my sabbaths . . . I will give them an everlasting name that shall not be cut off."

This establishes that God's love for those deemed "sexually other" predates Jesus' radical message of inclusion and love. God promises recognition and inclusion for all, regardless of whether they have been deemed outsiders.

5) Isaiah 43:1: "Do not fear, for I have called you by name, you are mine."

This verse reminds believers that we are loved and claimed by a God who redeems us and will always be with us. For many who are queer and/or transgender, this passage can serve as a reminder that we, too, are called by name and do not need to be afraid.

6) Galatians 3:23-29: "There is no longer Jew or Greek there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus."

Paul makes it clear that Christ's promise is abundant and available to all people, and that divisions and prejudices have no place in Christ's community. The phrase "there is no longer male and female" offers a challenge to traditional binary understandings of gender roles.

7) Matthew 22:37-40: "On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Matthew addresses the great number of Jewish laws and prophetic teachings, including those that many believe condemn homosexuality. He makes it clear that the overarching command is to love, love of God, and love of neighbor. This command underpins any and all other commands.

8) Psalm 139: "For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made."

This beautiful, famous psalm sings of God's intimate and intentional knowledge of each person. It

suggests that every crucial part of our identity was known to God, crafted by God before we were born and that, as beings made in such love, we are created good. *(Cont'd over)*

10 Bible Passages . . . cont'd

9) Matthew 15:21-28: "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' tables"

The nationality of the Canaanite woman makes her an outsider, and on this basis even Jesus rejects her when she comes seeking his help for her daughter. But the Canaanite woman challenges Jesus on his refusal, and Jesus praises her faith and heals her daughter after all. This demonstrates that God's love is so expansive, it can surprise and stretch even Jesus Christ himself.

10) 1 John 4:7-8: "<u>Beloved, let us love one another, be-</u> cause love is from God; everyone who loves is born of <u>God and knows God</u>."

This passage emphasizes the centrality of love and suggests that love is always from God, and a reflection of God. Thus any genuine love, no matter what form it takes, comes from God and glorifies God. Anyone seeking to follow God must also seek to love others. <u>Editor Note:</u> This article is an abridged version of the original article. For the full version, please visit:
