

"It's Christmas" is a delightful blend of traditional and contemporary Christmas music. It features traditional hymns like O Holy Night, fun novelty songs such as Thirty Second Fa-La-La and selections from movies and musicals like Elf, How the Grinch Stole Christmas and The Polar Express

Strathclair Theatre Chorus is directed by Elizabeth Gebauer (Brandon) and Jeremy Allen (Brandon) and accompanied on piano by Penny Menzies (Inglis) and Barry McNabb (Minnedosa) and on flute by Jeremy Allen. The 50 men and women who make up the ensemble this year come from Strathclair, Shoal Lake, Cardale, Elphinstone, Birtle, Sandy Lake, Rivers, Brandon, Onanole, Glenboro, Minnedosa, Basswood, and Erickson. They rehearse from mid-September to mid-November and then perform in various communities in southern Manitoba. This year, their schedule includes concerts in Minnedosa, Brandon, Hamiota and Strathclair.

The theatre chorus' first performance was at a dinner theatre on March 2nd, 1991, organized by Strathclair Theatre Committee Inc. as a fund-raiser for a renovation project at the Bend Theatre. It showcased the talents of 37 individuals, many of whom were members of the Strathclair Drama Club. A choir of 27 voices performed that evening, laying the groundwork for the growth and development of a strong, vibrant mixed-voice singing group.

Brandon School Board By-Election, October 25, 2023

On October 25, 2023 a by-election was held to elect two new board members to the Brandon School Board. During May of this year the school board saw a delegation that asked for the removal of transgender books from the school libraries and for the formation of a book review committee. These requests were subsequently denied after a very public meeting. The school board has been dealing with anti-LGBTQ2S+ activism since these events.

Brandon School Board had two wards where byelections were held and there were candidates who supported both sides of the aforementioned issue(s). The results of the by-election appear to have come out in favour of no censorship with the election of Lorraine McConnell in Ward 2 and Kirk Carr in Ward 1. Both McConnell and Carr say they want to unify the community and support children's education.

Carr's first order of business is "ending the hate" and building on the school board's stance on hate speech. "There's more business that needs to get attended to", Carr said. "We need to work

together. What's needed now is unity as a board and getting back to serving children, families, and education". McConnell also said that she wants to see a shift back to the board being able to focus on its job – children's education. "My expectation would be that derogatory hate speech would not be tolerated", said McConnell. "We all sometimes come at things from different perspectives, but I think we're all respectful and willing to listen to one another".

This by-election, not unlike other school board elections, saw a poor turnout of voters, however, those who did vote cast their intentions in favour of candidates who are respectful of all people and will help to move the board forward as a unified body in support of Brandon children's education. We are thankful to those who showed support to candidates in this election and hopeful for a unified Brandon School Board.

Building Climate Resiliency



"Women for Change" is an organization in Zambia that strives to improve conditions in rural communities by empowering women and girls. In Zambia, women are responsible for collecting firewood and charcoal and making food. Because of climate change they have to walk longer distances to get firewood and charcoal, so that means it is harder to make food. The organization

was established in 1992 and has a long-standing partnership with the United Church since 1995. From the beginning, mobilizing communities to share ideas and best practices has been key to the work. Since its inception, 1,500 community groups have been established, with 25-40 people in each group. The group discusses a variety of justice-related topics. Building climate resiliency by preparing for, recovering from, and adapting to drastically changing weather patterns is a priority. Groups discuss how they can save and share seeds, what they can plant with longer or shorter rains, and if there are traditional methods that can increase food production. They are grateful for the United Church's support, helping to building awareness and resiliency.
