Are you in a position where you need to downsize items in your home? When we accumulate so much it can be overwhelming. The following is something to consider for local Mission and Service.

If you have items you no longer need please consider "**Housing First**." They are located at 705 Rosser Avenue. The Coordinator is Samantha van den Ham and the phone number is 204-441-8575. They will even arrange a pick up with you.

(from the web site) **Housing First** is an approach to ending homelessness that centers on providing case management and supports to individuals/families in need. Once housing is secured the individuals are assisted to move in and some household and grocery items are provided. All donations go to help someone end their homelessness experience.

Items most needed are: couches, dressers, table/chairs, etc. Also towels, sheets, pillows and comforters are needed along with cooking utensils and pots/pans, toasters, microwaves, dishes, cutlery, etc. They will even take TV's, DVD players, board games and books. Old cellphones can be serviced as a pay as you go item for safety, education and daily communication.

This cold weather brings the need for mitts, toques, socks, jackets, scarves and boots. There is also a need for hygiene products and cleaning products.

#### Living in New Ways

Last Sunday, January 7, 2024, Rev. Doug's message asked us to reflect on Jesus' baptism as his demonstration of solidarity with humanity and publicly marking a beginning, a benchmark for the way forward into a new way of living.


#### TRINITY 55 PLUS MISSION FOR MITTENS CONTINUES.....


#### **Trinity Pictorial Directory**
