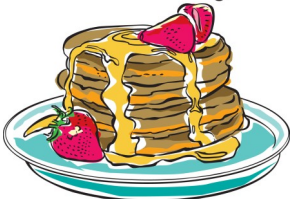

Sixty years ago this month four young British “mop heads” appeared on the Ed Sullivan Television Show in New York for the first time. They were called “The Beatles” and they were on their way to exerting a long lasting influence on rock and roll music, an influence that is said to have raised rock music to an art form.

To mark that anniversary, and to demonstrate the claim that the Beatles’ rock music can be considered an art form, the Brandon-based **Prairie Lights String Quartet** will be performing “An Evening With The Beatles”, a concert of many of the most popular Beatles songs in arrangements by Laura Jones and others. “Contrary to Lennon and McCartney’s lyrics in *Sgt. Pepper’s Lonely Hearts Club Band*, the Beatles’ music has never gone out of style,” says Jones: “The popularity of these songs is enduring and easily crosses the boundaries between so-called “rock” and “classical” formats. We look forward to sharing our classical take on these memorable songs with our audience, and we want them all to sing along!”

The members of the Quartet are well known Brandon players. A laureate of the Eckhardt-Grammaté Competition, violinist Kerry DuWors recently received her 20-year pin as a faculty member at Brandon University. Judit Jarmillo is a recent graduate of the Masters’ program at the BU School of Music, and violist Robert Richardson and cellist Laura Jones are both sessional faculty instructors at BU. Robert and Laura both grew up in Brandon, while Kerry is a native of Saskatchewan; Judit, from Mexico, has adopted Brandon as a home away from home.

The concert will take place at **First Presbyterian Church** in Brandon, a venue that is well known for the fine quality of its acoustics. The Concert begins at
7:30 p.m. on Thursday, February 29.
