The Legend of the Sand Dollar

There's a lovely little legend, that I would like to tell, of the birth and death of Jesus, found in this lowly shell.

If you examine it closely, you'll see that you find here, four nail holes and a fifth one, made by a Roman spear.

On one side is the Easter lily, its center is the star, that appeared unto the shepherds, and led them from afar.



The Christmas Poinsettia etched on the other side, reminds us of His birthday, our happy Christmastide.

Now break the center open, and here you will release, the five white doves awaiting, to spread Good Will and Peace.

This simple little symbol, Christ left for you and me, to help us spread his gospel, through all Eternity.

On March 17th, the Senior Sunday school class learned a little of symbolism found in nature.

St Patrick brought Christianity to Ireland and used the Shamrock for explanation. The three sections are for the Father, Son and Holy Spirit joined together with one stem for unity.

The Easter Lily petals are trumpet shaped which announce Christs return. The ugly bulb must be placed in the ground and die, then one day it will become a beautiful flower. This symbolizes Christ being placed in the tomb and being raised from the dead

Faye McLoughlin brought some Sand Dollars from Barbados and the class broke them open to discover the 5 Doves.

The Legend of the Sand Dollar was shared then the class enjoyed some Sand Dollar cookies

Almond Sand Dollar Cookies 325°

1 cup Crisco shortening (could use butter flavour) 1 cup sugar

1 large egg (room temperature) 1 ½ tsp almond extract 1 tsp baking powder ½ tsp salt

3 cups flour (Use 1-1 flour from Bulk Barn to make it gluten-free) 1-4 tsps water as needed

Cream together shortening and sugar.
Beat in egg, almond extract, baking powder and salt . Gradually add in the flour.
If dough is dry and crumbly, add water, 1 tsp at a time, until dough forms a ball.

f dough is too soft, refrigerate for an hour

Roll out half the dough about ¼ " thickness between two sheets of wax paper (important)

Cut out dough circles. Place on baking sheet.

*Optional: Press 5 almond slices into center of each cookie.

Use a straw or a toothpick to make the holes

Sprinkle with granulated sugar.

Bake 11-15 minutes (depends on your oven)
until cookies turn a bit golden.
Cookies are delicate.
Remove from pan onto a wire rack and
let cool completely before

let cool completely before putting into a container.

*cookies could be made without almonds or poking holes, but are tasty with sprinkled sugar


The Sister's & Janice Seddon were on fellowship duty; so missed the excitement upstairs. They had snacks for over 70 folk who came for fellowship that day!!

On Tuesday, March 19th, Trinity 55 Plus hosted guest speaker, Florence Halcrow, from 'The Blue Door'. Florence, a very Passionate, hard working leader, says she is trying to fill in the places where those less fortunate fall. This facility is located at 31A-9th St. and open from 11 am-7 pm. She said that there are between fifty-sixty people a day who use their space.

The Blue Door has an ID bank (medical card, photo ID), which they keep there so they are safe. When clients leave to their permanent homes, they take their information with them. Since they started this program in 2021, there have been over 500 files.

To make a monetary donation to the Blue Door, and get receipted for it, The John Howard Society takes these, and forwards the money to The Blue Door. Any cheque should indicate 'The Blue Door"

on the memo.








Messy Church on March 8th


Another fun filled, learning, dancing, story telling and fellowship evening!!






