

Racism Anti Racism (Nice until it isn't) Presentation, MVSD Trustee Paul Coffey, Monday, April 23, 2024 (Excepts in quotations from The Canadian Press, April 26, 2024)

Most of us will have read or heard of the above noted presentation given by a School Board Trustee from Dauphin. "The school trustee's comments on Indigenous people and residential schools have led to condemnation from many quarters and a review by the Manitoba government. Paul Coffey, a trustee in the Mountain View School Division in western Manitoba, told a school board meeting Monday that residential schools started as a good thing. They were essential for reading, writing, arithmetic, also enforcement of school attendance. It was all nice until its well-documented and openly expressed intention to use schools to assimilate, eradicated Indians' languages, cultures and spiritual beliefs." During the presentation Mr. Coffey continued to call Indigenous people Indians and commented that the term white privilege is racist. He also questions some conclusions from the 2015 Truth and Reconciliation Commission, notably, the authenticity of the claims of abuse because there are no good stories in Canada about residential schools. The Commission "spent years investigation and documenting the history and lasting harms of church-operated, government-funded residential schools that more than 150,000 Indigenous children were forced to attend, often far away from their families and communities. Prime Minister John A. Macdonald said in 1883 that children should be withdrawn as much as possible from parental influence in order to acquire the habits and thought of white people. Thousands suffered emotional, physical and sexual abuse." It is estimated that more than 4,000 children lost their lives.

The Southern Chiefs Organization, Manitoba Teacher's Society, and Superintendent of MVSD all renounced Mr. Coffey's presentation as ill informed, harmful, and damaging to strides made in reconciliation. Southern Chiefs have called for his removal and Manitoba Education Minister Nello Altomare is launching a governance review and will be in contact with the board chair and superintendent.

As citizens of Manitoba we must ask ourselves: Is there room for perceived racism on school boards in Manitoba? Do we see racist remarks in Mr. Coffey's presentation (some will not)? Do we believe that "white privilege" is real? Did PM John A. Macdonald know that he was committing Cultural Genocide by the creation of the Residential School system? If we are to truly believe in the process of reconciliation, we must do our best to look honestly at the harms done to Indigenous Communities (parents who were not allowed to parent/grandparent) by taking away their children, not just the harms done to the children themselves. Residential schools were created to try to make Indigenous persons assimilate into white society with no thought to what that process would create. Governments trusted churches to administer education and provide a proper Anglo-Saxon atmosphere for children (not allowing Indigenous language/spiritualization/traditions) and too many churches failed in this trust. The process was not only flawed, but criminal in too many cases and we must now pray for forgiveness of our forefathers and be patient, helpful, and thoughtful with the reconciliation process. The damage was not created overnight and reconciliation will not be complete for most likely generations into the future.
