
Affirming Vision, Trinity United Church, Brandon, MB

Samaritan House is much more than a depot for donated items. There is a motto on their facebook page: You can't go back and change the beginning, but you can start where you are and change the ending.


The Samaritan House Employment Resource Centre is located at 136-11th Street in Brandon. Staff provide services to help anyone looking for new or better employment opportunities. Computers, training work-shops, and one-on-one assistance is provided free of charge to those seeking meaningful employment. They also assist with employment applications, resumes and preparation for job interviews.

Another service provided is for Shelter and Housing. They offer a Safe and Warm Shelter from the frigid winter weather. They have a home called "Mary's House" for women and children who are escaping from domestic abuse. They offer support for the Brandon Housing First Program and Hoarding Support Services.

It is important to keep people fed, but it is equally important to establish self-esteem in people's lives.




