Affirming Vision, Trinity United Church, Brandon, MB



Thank you to the on going generosity of Trinity folk for the Thanksgiving Offering of \$495.00.


This will go to the YWCA.

The rose bushes needed no pruning but soil was put around the root base to protect them.

Once we finished trimming the rest of the perennials which were required to be cut back, we placed the leaves as mulch on top of the plants to help them survive the Winter.
