On November 21, 2021, Trinity United Church community of faith voted to be an affirming congregation. We agree to be public, intentional, and explicit in our commitment to diversity and inclusion. Inside and outside of the church walls, we agree to live a radical message of God's love and inclusion to everyone equally without reserve.

As an intentional ministry, we are encouraged to examine where we need to grow. Our Equity and Diversity committee is tasked with guiding diversity in all the various ministries of Trinity, providing educational events, and partnering with other Affirming Ministries. Posts on Affirm United indicate educational activities in other congregations include such subjects as how to address media and parenting/grandparenting LGBTQ+ and Transgendered youth.



Please clearly indicate money is for payment for your gift cards.


Credit cards cannot be used as a method of payment.




Trinity's Prayer Shawl Group




And the king will answer them, "Truly, I tell you, just as you did it to one of least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me."
