Classes will resume **January 19th**, **2025** and not January 12th as previously indicated.



#### **Centennial Commemoration**

#### **NEW:** Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year

Throughout 2025, we'll be featuring very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle Simonson, a lay member of the United Church at Southminster Steinhauer in Edmonton, an experienced history researcher, and a writer who has written for historical journals and UCC publications. She is a key volunteer in the United Church archives for both Northern Spirit and Chinook Winds. Gayle's generosity means that we'll have frequent reminders of our history with a focus on ordinary people. To lead us off, she writes,

"As western Canada was settled, communities sprang up but populations remained sparse. It was difficult to sustain a church congregation, so many churches of different denominations came together to form union churches. As the idea spread, denominations were encouraged to look at amalgamation. By 1925, Methodists, Presbyterians and Congregationalists had agreed and the United Church of Canada was formed by an act of parliament; in the end, not all Presbyterian congregations agreed to join, so they remain an ecumenical partner today.

Over the next year, we hope to present some highlights of our church history here in our Regional newsletters. We must not be bound by the past, but we do well to remember our history and to celebrate those who have brought us to this place."



### From Trinity Equity and Diversity

As we enter 2025, a sense of insecurity faces our nation in many ways. Factions internally and internationally put many Canadians in an existential crisis. How will this impact rights, freedoms, prosperity, and, perhaps, even our national identity?

LGBTQ2S+ communities are not strangers to living with such uncertainties at a personal level. *CTV news* is hosting an eight-part series investigating a backsliding of LGBTQ2S+ rights in Africa and the consequences for Canada as a country with a feminist foreign policy, which prioritizes gender equality and human dignity. In Africa, external forces such as American Evangelical organizations and the Russian government are sowing anti-LGBTQ2S+ sentiments. Laws are targeting the Community, supporters, health-care providers, and even, landlords of LGBTQ2S+.

While things are grim for the LGBTQ2s+ community and their allies in Africa, the United Church of Canada is a beacon of hope. "However, some LGBTQ2S+ communities are tapping into religion as a source of empowerment instead of oppression, working with the United Church of Canada to create their own church services and to push for more affirming congregations."
