Our Good Neighbours' Loss of Human Rights

Mark 12:30-31 "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these."



President Trump, just hours into his mandate, passed an executive order that recognizes only two genders, male and female, as the only two sexes in the USA. In part this order states that "female means a person belonging, <u>at conception</u>, to the sex that produces the large reproductive cell, and male means a person belonging , <u>at conception</u>, to the sex that produces the small reproductive cell." At conception may be reaching somewhat as distinguishing changes begin between 9 and 13 weeks of gestation for formation of internal reproduction organs.

This order will in fact reverse and/or threaten protections for transgender and gender non-conforming people (ex.intersex and nonbinary). Their ability to complete federal forms and access government funded facilities will have to align with their gender identity, which can only be male or female. Examples include but are not limited to domestic violence shelters, health care facilities, schools, public accommodations, workplaces and prisons.

This order from President Trump is unsurprisingly patriarchal and transphobic and brought into being to begin the rollback of hard-fought changes in recent years for protections and better healthcare of transgendered

citizens. It will also enable hate to flourish toward those with non-conforming genders, putting them more at risk for violence, discrimination and harassment. As an Affirming Church, what can we do? I'm of the opinion that though we cannot change President Trump's order or "thoughts", we can continue in our families and our own little spheres to be supportive, kind, and inclusive.

February is Black History Month

During Black History Month, we honour and amplify the voices of Black Canadians while celebrating their many achievements and contributions. The efforts of Black Canadians and their communities throughout history have greatly enriched Canada's cultural diversity, compassion and prosperity.

Black History Month in Canada

Black Canadians and their communities have been a part of shaping Canada's heritage and identity since the arrival of Mathieu Da Costa, a navigator and interpreter whose presence in Canada dates back to the early 1600s.

The role of Black people and their communities in Canada has largely been ignored as a key part of Canada's history. There is little mention that some of the Loyalists who came here after the American Revolution and settled in the Maritimes were people of African descent, nor the fact that many soldiers of African descent made many sacrifices in wartime as far back as the War of 1812.

Few people in Canada are aware of the fact that African people were once enslaved in the territory that is now known as Canada, or of how those who fought enslavement helped to lay the foundation of Canada's diverse and inclusive society.

Black History Month is a time to learn more about these Canadian stories and the many other important contributions that Black Canadians and their communities have made to the history and continued growth of this country.

Recognizing Black History Month in Canada

In 1978, the Ontario Black History Society (OBHS) was established. Its founders, including Dr. Daniel G. Hill and Wilson O. Brooks, presented a petition to the City of Toronto to have February formally proclaimed as Black History Month. In 1979, the first-ever Canadian proclamation was issued by Toronto.

The first Black History Month in Nova Scotia was observed in 1988 and later renamed African Heritage Month in 1996.

In 1993, the OBHS successfully filed a petition in Ontario to proclaim February as Black History Month. Following that success, Rosemary Sadlier, president of the OBHS, introduced the idea of having Black History Month recognized across Canada to the Honourable Jean Augustine, the first Black Canadian woman elected to Parliament.

In December 1995, the House of Commons officially recognized February as Black History Month in Canada following a motion introduced by Dr. Augustine. The House of Commons carried the motion unanimously.

In February 2008, Senator Donald Oliver, the first Black man appointed to the Senate, introduced the <u>Motion to Recognize Contributions of Black Canadians and February as Black</u> <u>History Month</u>. It received unanimous approval and was adopted on March 4, 2008. The adoption of this motion completed Canada's parliamentary position on Black History Month.
