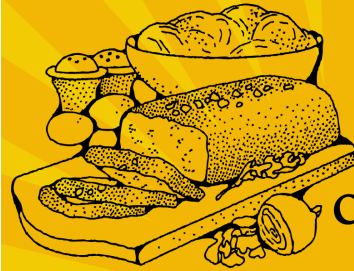

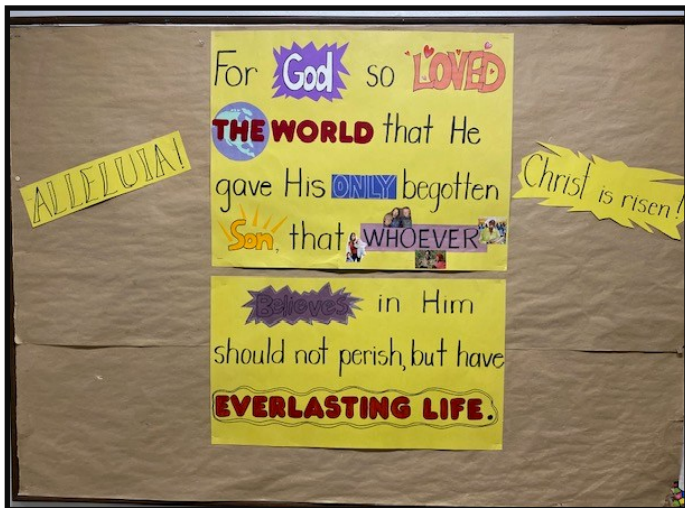

## Hymn History ~ In the Garden

It is very nice to think of this well-loved hymn being written in a peaceful garden early in the morning, 'while the dew is still on the roses'— but this is not so.

It was written by C Austin Miles while he meditated on John 20:1-18. The truth is that it was written in a darkroom, surrounded by his photography equipment, and organ in March 1912 and fuelled by his imagination. His imagination took over as he wrote a poem in which a weeping Mary Magdeline finally recognized the risen Jesus after He spoke to her. The hymn also known as 'I Come to the Garden Alone', which speaks of a personal relationship with Jesus, which we all want.

in addition to writing the poem, Austin Miles also composed the music. He was a very talented man. This hymn was made popular during the Billy Graham crusades.

**Regional Council Meeting: The 2026 Prairie to Pine Regional Council Meeting will take place from May 28 to 31, 2026, at Selkirk United Church.**

In Harvey's workbook submission upon his retirement, he recalls his ordination in 1977 when the Conference Annual Meeting was held in the small town of Eriksdale, MB. As a Candidate for ministry, Harvey ministered in Norway House and Viscount Pastoral Charge. 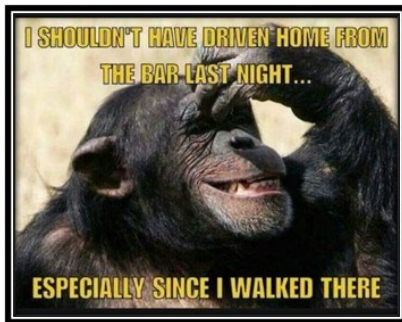
